ATTENDANCE

The average daily attendance in Bismarck Public Schools during the 2015-16 school year was 96.6%. The drop-out rate at Bismarck High and Century for that year was 0.7% or 19 students. The total number of graduates from BHS, CHS and our alternative high school, South Central, was 822 in June of 2016.

BUDGET

The average instructional cost to educate a child in Bismarck in 2015-2016 was \$9,926. The average cost per pupil in North Dakota was \$10,523 in 2015-2016, which is the most recent data available.

The school district's budget in all funds for 2016-2017 is \$159 million. Based on an estimated mill levy, the owner of a median \$100,000 home in Burleigh County would pay \$449 in school taxes. Here is a breakdown of last year's budget:
